

Learning Outcome – Integrity (Stage Development Rubric)

Law students should demonstrate, through knowledge and actions, professional formation of **Integrity** for ethical practice in the legal profession. Practicing law with integrity means that a lawyer exhibits honesty, steadfastness, and ethical coherence and acts consistently with integrated personal and professional values even when self-interest is at risk.

<u>Level 1</u> Novice Learner	Possesses limited or no understanding of professional standards relevant to practicing law with integrity. Is beginning to recognize relationship between personal values and professional values.
<u>Level 2</u> Advanced Beginner Learner	Exhibits basic understanding of professional standards relevant to practicing law with integrity. Can begin to articulate the relationship between personal values and professional values.
<u>Level 3</u> Intermediate Learner	Exhibits understanding of professional standards relevant to practicing law with integrity. Can explain how a lawyer's decision making can integrate personal and professional values even when self-interest is at risk.
<u>Level 4</u> Competent Learner	Exhibits advanced understanding of professional standards relevant to practicing law with integrity. Commits to act consistently with integrated personal and professional values even when self-interest is at risk.
<u>Level 5</u> Exceptional Learner	Exhibits nuanced understanding and internalized high valuation of professional standards relevant to practicing law with integrity. Acts consistently with integrated personal and professional values even when self-interest is at risk.
